The mission of the Bennington Public Library is to inspire lifelong learning, advance knowledge, and strengthen community. To deliver on this promise we rely on three great resources: our staff, our collection, and our physical space.

Library Programs and Services

Last month's program attendance and circulation statistics are included in the February statistical report.

The library received over 40 online signups for the Nebraska Federation of Women's Clubs **District II Art Show** from Bennington and homeschool students ranging from kindergarten through 12th grade. Twenty-eight art pieces advanced to the show which was held in Bellevue on March 22. Twenty-five received ribbons. Nine received first place ribbons and advanced to the Nebraska Women's Club State Convention Art Contest in Lincoln in April. All art pieces will be on display at the library through the month of April.

March Book Madness is in full swing. Winners will be announced April 7.

Johnna will conduct an **Out and About Storytime** at Cup and Cone on Wednesday, April 9th at 10:00 AM.

Our first library **Cat Café** with Felius is this Saturday, March 29th, 9:30 - 11:30 AM. Anyone interested in adopting a cat will need to get pre-approved through the Felius website (<https://felius.org/adopt>) before the event. This event is open to patrons ages 7 and up.

The most recent draft of our **Summer Reading** brochure is attached. As soon as the location of our Star Party is confirmed it will be sent to the printer. The Friends of the Library approved funding for the sponsorship of prizes and the brochure printing costs.

Technology

We did not receive an affordable bid proposal for the fiber optic special construction e-rate funding project. There is a two-week grace period which still gives vendors time to submit a proposal. Cox expressed interest last year but did not meet the deadline. I reached a new Cox representative today. He expressed interest in submitting a proposal. We shall see...

I learned that the company that manages our lighting controls is no longer in business. I will be meeting with a representative from Strategic Electric (the city's electrician) this week to determine our options going forward.

The all-in-one computer which Jason Nocita delivered turned out to not be a touch screen. I am currently researching other possibilities and will consult with our tech contact at the Nebraska Library Commission before proceeding with the purchase of an all-in-one touch screen.

Personnel/Continuing Education

Heather's dad passed away suddenly last week. She is expected to return from bereavement leave on Thursday.

I attended the Nebraska Library Association's Advocacy Day in Lincoln last week. I missed seeing our Nebraska State Senator Kristy Armendariz as she was in a legislative session during my visit, but had a chance to talk with a member of her staff.
